






Although most stores, restaurants, and other services do accept debit or credit cards, knowing how to identify and use American currency is still an important skill. American money, also referred to as "cash", can be used at most physical establishments. Cash can often be used at times that a card cannot (i.e. some small businesses, or paying money to a friend)

Coin	Value	Equivalence to a Dollar	Occurance
Penny 	1 cent \$.01	100 pennies = one dollar	Common
Nickel 	5 cents \$.05	20 nickles = one dollar	Very Common
Dime 	10 cents \$.10	10 dimes = one dollar	Very Common
Quarter 	25 cents \$.25	4 quarters = one dollar	Most Common
One Dollar 	1 dollar \$1	1 dollar coin = one dollar	Not Common

Bill	Value	Occurance
1 Dollar Bill	one dollar \$1	Very Common
5 Dollar Bill	five dollars \$5	Very Common
10 Dollar Bill	ten dollars \$10	Pretty Common
20 Dollar Bill	twenty dollars \$20	Very Common
50 Dollar Bill	Fifty dollars \$50	Not Common
100 Dollar Bill	One hundred dollars \$100	Pretty Common

Large bills like 50's and 100's may not be accepted by some small businesses.
