English Support

The University of Georgia offers abundant resources to support international students' language development. International students can enroll in English language courses tailored to their proficiency levels through the Intensive English Program, participate in International Coffee Hour, and engage in conversations with learners across the globe through the ESL Conversation Circle. You will find more information about these opportunities below.

Intensive English Program

The Intensive English Program (IEP) at UGA offers courses that focus on developing students' listening & speaking, reading & writing, and conversation & presentation skills. Courses are taught on the intermediate advanced levels. Intermediate and level courses focus on everyday English whereas advanced level courses focus on academic and professional English. The IEP course schedule follows UGA's academic calendar. taught in fall and spring Courses are semesters and the Thru Term (June and July). For enrolled UGA students, the IEP application fee will be waived. International graduate students can apply to have the tuition for one IEP course waived. Every Wednesday afternoon, the energetic group meets with a primary objective: improving their English conversation skills. Participants hail from countries as varied as Cuba, China, Brazil, Turkey, Japan, and South Korea, and the reasons that brought them to Athens are varied as well. Some are visiting scholars at the University of Georgia while others have moved to the area to be with family. Some have lived in the U.S. for years, others for a few months.

The Hello House Language & Learning Center
